

Admission requirements according to § 49 paragraph 3 of Act No. 111/98 Coll.

The Higher Education Act, as amended

In accordance with § 49 of Act No. 111/98 Coll., The Higher Education Act, as amended, and also in accordance with paragraph 6 of Article 3 of Annex 5 of the Statute of Charles University in Prague - Admission Procedure Regulations, different admission requirements are set for students who completed all or part of their study, or are studying any other study program, at a university in the Czech Republic or abroad.

Different admission requirements:

A) students that are studying at medical faculties

Deadline for submission of application form: 5th of September, 2014

1) Basic admission requirement:

The basic admission requirement is that the student successfully completes the academic year at the faculty from which the student is applying and this academic year must precede the academic year into which the student wishes to be admitted, as indicated by his/her application form.

As successful completion of the academic year is considered the fulfillment of all enrolled study courses for the given segment of study, not the fulfillment of requirements for admittance into the next section of the study program.

2) The Dean will decide regarding admission should the following prerequisites be met cumulatively:

- 2.1) submission of application form (SEVT form) including a copy of the proof of payment of the administrative fee of 530,-Kč by the 5th of September, 2014;
- 2.2) submission of a notary-certified copy of the secondary school diploma/leaving certificate. Applicants that attended a secondary school in a foreign country (except for countries with which the Czech Republic has an international agreement on the recognition of achieved education) shall submit a decision or certificate of recognition of completion of secondary education by the 30th of September, 2014;
- 2.3) proof of knowledge of the Czech language at the level of C1 examination;
- 2.4) successfully completed academic year 2013/2014 - must be approved by a transcript of successfully completed examinations and a certificate of completion of the given academic year issued by the faculty;
- 2.5) completed study requirements based on the study plan have to be compatible with the study requirements of the respective study plan at the Third Faculty of Medicine, Charles University in Prague.

3) A maximum of 7 students may be enrolled into each study program and each form of study. The criterion for ranking is the grade average during the whole period of study.

Along with the application form and proof of payment of the administrative fee, the applicant shall submit a photocopy of his/her index, a transcript of achieved grades and study requirements completed during study, as well as a confirmation of the completion of the study year.

All such annexes must be confirmed by the Study Department of the faculty at which the student studied.

B) students that have already studied the General Medicine study program at the Third Faculty of Medicine in part

Deadline for the submission of the application form: 30th of June, 2014

1) Basic conditions for admittance:

- 1.1) successfully completed 3rd year at the Third Faculty of Medicine, Charles University in Prague and the achievement of at least 180 credits;
- 1.2) the applicant was enrolled in study between 1st of June, 2003 – 31st of October, 2008;
- 1.3) the applicant terminated study in means other than proper between 1st of September, 2013 - 30th of June, 2014.

2) Other prerequisites for admittance:

2.1) submission of application form (SEVT form) including a copy of the proof of payment of the administrative fee of 530,-Kč by the 30th of June, 2014;

3) The entrance examination will be on the 1st of August, 2014:

Interview:

– includes the interpretation of a science article – maximum of 25 points, evaluation of communication skills, decision-making skills, general knowledge – maximum of 37 points.

Minimum and maximum number of points: 12 - 62

4) A maximum of 5 students may be enrolled to study.
